All the children were respectful and contributed gestures of remembrance under our three flags.



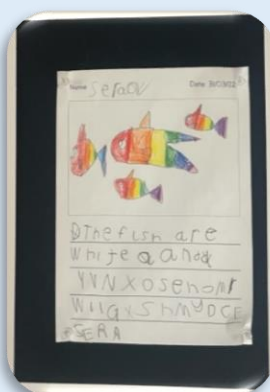
All our leaders did a great job reading precious poems and text about what our peacekeepers endured during this time in our history.

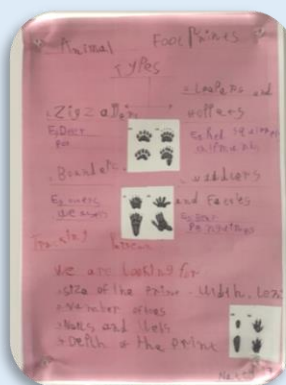
I would encourage all children to work towards getting a piece of their own onto our beautiful board so they can share it with their family.

Here are our first successful children for 2022 and their pieces. Congratulations!



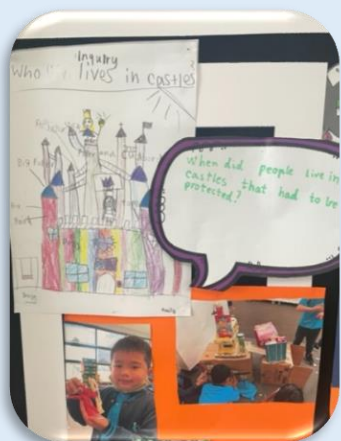
Sera-FG

Robbie-4J

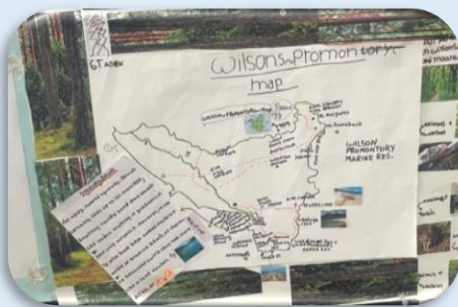
