Classrooms were buzzing with curiosity, creativity and student voice, as visitors explored a range of engaging activities and displays.

Foundation Learning Highlights – Term 2

This term began with an exciting excursion to Moonlit Sanctuary, sparking curiosity about Australian animals, their features, habitats, and what living things need to survive. This inquiry linked to our maths learning on mapping and spatial awareness.

In class, students created their own stick insect habitat to explore animal adaptations through hands-on learning. In Literacy, they have been building confidence with letter sounds, reading simple texts, and exploring story structure through shared stories and poems.

In Mathematics, students developed number skills including counting to 20, combining numbers, and one-to-one correspondence. They also explored informal measurement, patterns, and 2D shapes in their environment. It's been a fantastic term full of discovery and growth!




















Year 1 & 2 Learning Highlights - Term 2

It's been a busy and engaging term of learning for our Year 1 and 2 students, with exciting growth across all areas of the curriculum.

This term in Literacy, students-built confidence as readers and writers through the InitiaLit program. They explored digraphs, tricky words, and grammar, and created imaginative and informative texts using clear structure and rich vocabulary.

In Maths, students engaged in hands-on learning to strengthen their number sense and problem-solving. They explored skip counting, addition, subtraction, data, and time—with Year 2 students extending into 3-digit numbers, money, and giving directions.

We're incredibly proud of the curiosity, creativity, and teamwork our Year 1 and 2 students have shown this term!




Years 3 and 4 Learning Highlights-Term 2

This term in Maths, students explored measurement concepts such as length, area, perimeter, volume, and capacity. A standout was the *Potato Olympics*, where students designed potato athletes and competed in fun, hands-on events to apply their learning.

In Literacy, students enjoyed a novel study of *Matilda* by Roald Dahl. They deepened their comprehension skills and experimented with narrative writing, using techniques like similes, metaphors, and onomatopoeia to bring their characters and settings to life.

Through the Mappen unit *Our Island Home*, students investigated climate zones, food chains, and island cultures. They finished the unit by researching a neighbouring country and designing their own island to share with peers.



























Year 5 and 6 Learning Highlights-Term 2

In Maths in year 5 and 6 we have focused on a number of areas including learning about fractions, decimals and percentages. There were opportunities for students to use real life maths during measurement, probability and statistics.

In Reading, the Grade 5 and 6 students have been looking into a variety of reading skills, such as reading fluency, summarising, making connections, inferencing and more!

In Writing, students are working on a range of different text types including poetry, information reports, persuasive pieces and newspaper reports. They are varying their structure for the different text types and using their writer's voice accordingly.

It's been a term full of rich learning and confident communication!



Specialists' subjects highlight Term 2

Art Summary – Foundation to Year 6

This term in Art, students have explored a range of materials, techniques, and artists:

Years 5–6 have been working with clay to create relief carvings, learning how to join clay and build using coils and slabs



Years 3–4 are constructing 3D birds using recycled materials, practising paper techniques such as twisting, scrunching, and rolling. They will paint their sculptures in Term 3.



Years 1–2 created painted landscapes inspired by Indigenous artist Bronwyn Bancroft, incorporating Indigenous-style patterns and designs.



Foundation students have been learning about primary and secondary colours, using oil pastels and crayons. They've begun work on their Foundation Art books and explored collage through creating echidnas.



Music Summary - Foundation to Year 6

This term in Music, students have been exploring a variety of music genres:

Years 3–6 learned about different genres, comparing their features and origins. A class favourite was exploring the history of rap and its connections to blues music.

Foundation to Year 2 focused on identifying musical genres and the instruments used in each. They practised listening skills to recognise instruments and shared their preferences for different styles of music.

PE Summary – Foundation to Year 6

This term in PE, students built their physical skills and teamwork:

Foundation to Year 2 focused on developing fundamental motor skills like throwing, catching, bouncing, and balancing through fun games and activities. They also practised teamwork, following rules, and playing safely and fairly.

Years 3–6 refined their skills in Basketball, Cricket, Soccer, NFL Flag, and Track and Field. They improved technique, strategy, and game awareness while promoting fair play and inclusive participation.



EWA Summary – Foundation to Year 6

This semester, students across the school celebrated cultural events such as the Spring Festival, Easter, and the Dragon Boat Festival, deepening their understanding of cultural traditions.

Foundation students learned to count in Chinese using finger gestures, practised writing numbers, and explored family vocabulary through drawing activities.

Years 1–2 built foundational language skills, including basic greetings, classroom phrases, numbers, and vocabulary for fruits, zodiac animals, and school items through interactive tasks.

Years 3–4 expanded their language through topics like birthdays, dates, and food, while learning to speak, read, and type in Chinese. They also explored cultural traditions across Asia.

Years 5–6 focused on hobbies, daily routines, and cultural comparisons, developing skills in speaking, typing, and constructing sentences, while learning about Chinese chess, martial arts, and daily life in Japan.

DigiTech Summary - Foundation to Year 6

This term in DigiTech, students developed digital skills and explored online safety:

Foundation students learned basic digital skills like typing, taking photos, using drawing tools, and sharing creative work through Dojo.

Years 1–2 focused on understanding personal vs public information and staying safe online, creating posters and activities to show safe sharing practices.

Years 3–4 explored how peripheral devices work and designed interactive board games to teach others, reflecting on game design and improvement.

Years 5–6 took part in the *eSmart Digital Licence+* program, learning about digital wellbeing, safe online behaviour, screen time, and digital footprints through engaging modules and discussions.



We are so proud of what our students, staff, and community have achieved together this term.
