Learning Focus

This term we continue our **strong emphasis on learning routines** in the classroom and how we monitor students' progress using mini whiteboards, turn & talk and exit tickets. We are also digging deeper into **classroom environments and setting kids up for success** in their learning spaces.

Our tutor learning initiative for enhancement and enrichment continues across the school with a focus on phonics in Foundation, MiniLit and Levelled Literacy Intervention in Years 2-6 and Numeracy support and extension from year 3-6 using Bond Blocks (support) and highly engaging, challenging tasks (Middle Years Maths Challenges) to extend children with high abilities in mathematics.

I'd also like to acknowledge Willow F (Year 5) and Simarleen K (Year 6) for being selected for the **Victorian High Abilities Program in English and Mathematics**, respectively. This is a great opportunity for Willow and Simarleen to shine and share their knowledge in Writing and Problem Solving.

Our annual swimming program is also underway. Thanks to Tim O'Neil for scheduling and organising buses and pool times so all our students can participate in this vital health and physical education program.

Thanks too, to families for your support in getting the kids ready every morning to attend these sessions.



Wellbeing, Values & Behaviour Support

Our School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) continues this term and further consolidates the work our team has been focused on this year.

We are delighted to have been awarded the Blue award for the commitments made across the school in 2025, a great achievement and one to be proud of for our staff and students.


We will continue with our positive behaviour rewards system—raffling off prizes every Friday at assembly for students who collect rewards for demonstrating our core values-


Colour Run – Coming in Term 4!



Whether you're biking or riding an e-scooter, follow these simple road safety tips to stay safe and have fun on the move!

MODIFIED OR PETROL POWERED BICYCLES

Illegal.




MOTORBIKES

- To ride on or off-road it must be registered with a full or recreation registration
- Helmet must be worn at all times.




E-BIKES

- 25 km/h MAX speed
- Motor cannot provide power at speeds higher than 25km/h
- · Helmet must be worn at all times
- No passengers
- · Cannot be ridden on footpaths.



E-SCOOTER

- Be aged 16 yrs or over
- Max speed 20 kmph
- Helmet must be worn at all times
- No passengers
- Cannot be ridden on footpaths.
